The unaudited condensed financial statements should be read in conjunction with the audited financial statements for the financial year ended 30 June 2016.

#### 1. Basis of preparation

The unaudited condensed financial statements for the financial period ended 30 September 2016 have been prepared under the historical cost convention, as modified by the revaluation of financial investments available-for-sale and financial assets/financial liabilities at fair value through profit or loss (including derivative financial instruments).

The unaudited condensed financial statements have been prepared in accordance with MFRS 134: Interim Financial Reporting issued by the Malaysian Accounting Standard Board ("MASB") and paragraph 9.22 of Bursa Malaysia Securities Berhad's Listing Requirements and should be read in conjunction with the audited annual financial statements for the Group and the Company for the financial year ended 30 June 2016. The explanatory notes attached to the unaudited condensed financial statements provide an explanation of events and transactions that are significant to an understanding of the changes in the financial position and performance of the Group and the Company since the financial year ended 30 June 2016.

The unaudited condensed financial statements incorporated those activities relating to Islamic banking business which have been undertaken by the Group. Islamic banking business refers generally to the acceptance of deposits and granting of financing under the principles of Shariah.

The significant accounting policies and methods of computation applied in the unaudited condensed financial statements are consistent with those adopted in the annual audited financial statements for the financial period ended 30 June 2016 and modified for the adoption of the following Amenments to MFRSs applicable for financial period beginning on or after 1 July 2016:

(i) Amendment to MFRS 11 "Joint Arrangements"

Amendment to MFRS 116 "Property, Plant and Equipment"

Amendment to MFRS 138 "Intangible Assets"

The adoption of the above amendments to MFRSs are not expected to have impact on the financial results of the Group and Company.

The preparation of unaudited condensed financial statements in conformity with the MFRS requires the use of certain critical accounting estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the unaudited condensed financial statements, and the reported amounts of income and expenses during the reported period. It also requires Directors to exercise their judgement in the process of applying the Group and the Company's accounting policies. Although these estimates and assumptions are based on the Directors' best knowledge of current events and actions, actual results may differ from those estimates.

### 2. Status of matters giving rise to the auditor's qualified report in the preceding annual financial statement for the year ended 30 June 2016

There was no qualified report issued by the auditors in the preceding annual financial statements for the year ended 30 June 2016.

#### 3. Seasonality or cyclicality of operations

The business operations of the Group and the Company have not been materially affected by any seasonal and cyclical factors.

#### 4. Exceptional items or unusual events affecting financial statements

There were no exceptional items or unusual events that materially affected the financial statements.

#### 5. Variation from financial estimates reported in preceding financial period

There were no material changes in estimates of amounts reported in the prior financial year that have a material effect in the current period.

#### 6. Issuance and repayment of debt and equity securities

There was no repayment of debt or equity share, share buy-back, share cancellation, shares held as treasury shares nor resale of treasury shares in HLFG for the financial period ended 31 December 2016 other than as mentioned below.

a) Purchase of shares pursuant to Executive Share Option Scheme ("ESOS") and Executive Share Scheme ("ESS")

As at 31 December 2016, there is no outstanding options to be vested and exercised.

As at 31 December 2016, the total number of Treasury Shares for ESOS is 500 at an average price of RM6.31 per share and the total consideration paid, including transaction costs was RM3,155.

During the financial period ended 31 December 2016, no shares were exercised pursuant to the Company's ESOS.

The remaining number of shares held by the appointed trustee for the insurance subsidiary companies as at 31 December 2016 was 3,963,900 units at an average price of RM9.01 per share with total consideration paid, including transaction costs was RM35,709,188 which have been classified as treasury shares for ESOS at the Group level.

#### 7. Dividends paid

Single-tier interim dividend of 13.0 sen per share amounting to RM149.2 million was paid on 23 December 2016.

#### 22. Capital adequacy

The banking subsidiaries' regulatory capital is governed by BNM Capital Adequacy Framework guidelines. With effect from 1 January 2013, the capital adequacy ratios of the banking subsidiaries are computed in accordance with BNM's Capital Adequacy Framework issued on 28 November 2012 and its revised version on 13 October 2015 (the "Framework"). The Framework sets out the approach for computing the regulatory capital adequacy ratios, the minimum levels of the ratios at which banking institutions are required to operate as well as requirement on Capital Conservation Buffer ("CCB") and Counter Cyclical Buffer ("CCyB"). The minimum capital adequacy requirements for Common Equity Tier I (CET I) capital ratio, Tier I capital ratio and Total Capital ratio are 4.50%, 6.00% and 8.00% respectively. The Group are also required to maintain CCB of up to 2.50% of total risk weighted assets ("RWA"), which is phased in starting with 0.625% in year 2016, 1.250% in year 2017, 1.875% in year 2018 and 2.500% in year 2019. The CCyB which ranges from 0% up to 2.50% is determined as the weighted average of prevailing CcyB rates applied in the jurisdictions in which a financial institution has credit exposures. There is no BNM announcement on the CcyB rates yet.

The risk-weighted assets ("RWA") of the banking subsidiaries have adopted the Standardised Approach for Credit Risk and Market Risk, and the Basic Indicator Approach for Operational Risk computation.

- (a) Wah Tat Nominees (Tempatan) Sdn Bhd, a wholly-owned subsidiary of WTB Corporation Sdn Bhd which in turn is a wholly-owned subsidiary of HLF Credit (Perak) Bhd, a wholly-owned subsidiary of Hong Leong Bank Berhad ("HLB"), was dissolved on 15 October 2016.
- (b) HLG Nominee (Asing) Sdn Bhd, a wholly-owned subsidiary of Hong Leong Investment Bank Berhad ("HLIB") which in turn is a wholly-owned subsidiary of Hong Leong Capital Berhad ("HLCB"), was dissolved on 15 October 2016.
- (c) HLG Nominee (Tempatan) Sdn Bhd, a wholly-owned subsidiary of HLIB which in turn is a wholly-owned subsidiary of HLCB, was dissolved on 7 December 2016.
- (d) HLG Principal Investments (L) Limited, a wholly-owned subsidiary of HLG Capital Markets Sdn Bhd which in turn is a wholly-owned subsidiary of HLCB, was dissolved on 25 December 2016.
- (e) On 6 January 2017, HLB announced that the liquidator of Wah Tat Nominees (Asing) Sdn Bhd ("WTNA"), a wholly-owned subsidiary of WTB which in turn is a wholly-owned subsidiary of HLB, had convened the final meeting for WTNA to conclude the member's voluntary winding-up of WTNA. The Return by Liquidator Relating to Final Meeting of WTNA was lodged on 6 January 2017 with the Companies Commission of Malaysia and the Official Receiver, and on the expiration of 3 months after the said lodgement date, WTNA will be dissolved.
- (f) On 17 February 2017, HLB announced that the liquidator of Prominic Berhad ("Prominic"), a wholly-owned subsidiary of HLB, had convened the final meeting for Prominic to conclude the member's voluntary winding-up of Prominic. The Return by Liquidator Relating to Final Meeting of Prominic was lodged on 17 February 2017 with the Companies Commission of Malaysia and the Official Receiver, and on the expiration of 3 months after the said lodgement date, Prominic will be dissolved.

#### 25. Related party transactions

b. Hong Leong Asset Management Bhd, a wholly-owned subsidiary company of Hong Leong Capital Berhad ("HLCB"), is the Manager of Hong Leong Consumer Products Sector Fund ("Funds"). HLCB provided a guarantee to Deutsche Trustee Malaysia Berhad, the trustee of the Funds, that if the funds fall below the minimum fund size of RM1 million, HLCB would invest cash, equivalent to the shortfall, into the relevant fund.

The size of the fund was above the minimum of RM1 million as at 31 December 2016 (30 June 2016: RM1 million).

#### 27. Fair value of financial instruments

Financial instruments comprise financial assets and financial liabilities. Fair value is the amount at which a financial asset could be exchanged or a financial liability settled, between knowledgeable and willing parties in an arm's length transaction. The information presented herein represents the estimates of fair values as at the statements of financial position date.

Where available, quoted and observable market prices are used as the measure of fair values. Where such quoted and observable market prices are not available, fair values are estimated based on a range of methodologies and assumptions regarding risk characteristics of various financial instruments, discount rates, estimates of future cash flows and other factors. Changes in the uncertainties and assumptions could materially affect these estimates and the resulting fair value estimates.

#### Determination of fair value and fair value hierarchy

The Group and the Company measure fair values using the following fair value hierarchy that reflects the significance of the inputs used in making the measurements:

- Level 1: Quoted prices (unadjusted) in active markets for identical assets or liabilities.
- Level 2: Quoted prices for identical or similar instruments in markets that are not active; and model-derived valuations in which inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly.
- Level 3: Valuations derived from valuation techniques in which one or more significant inputs are not based on observable market data.

Financial instruments are classified as Level 1 if their value is observable in an active market. Such instruments are valued by reference to unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets where the quoted prices is readily available, and the price represents actual and regularly occurring market transactions. An active market is one in which transactions occur with sufficient volume and frequency to provide pricing information on an on-going basis. These would include actively traded listed equities and actively exchange-traded derivatives.

Where fair value is determined using unquoted market prices in less active markets or quoted prices for similar assets and liabilities, such instrument are generally classified as Level 2.

In cases where quoted prices are generally not available, the Group then determines fair value based upon valuation techniques that use as inputs, market parameters including but not limited to yield curves, volatilities and foreign exchange rates. The majority of valuation techniques employ only observable market data and so reliability of the fair value measurement is high.

Financial instruments are classified as Level 3 if their valuation incorporates significant inputs that are not based on observable market data (unobservable inputs). Such inputs are generally determined based on observable inputs of a similar nature, historical observations on the level of the input or other analytical techniques.

#### 1 Review of performance

#### Current quarter against previous corresponding quarter

HLFG Group recorded a profit before tax of RM832.5 million for the current quarter ended 31 December 2016 compared to RM487.4 million in the previous corresponding quarter, an increase of RM345.1 million or 70.8%. Excluding the one-off MSS expense in the previous corresponding quarter, the Group PBT increased by RM173.4 mil or 26.3%. The increase was mainly due to higher contribution across all operating divisions.

Hong Leong Bank Group recorded a profit before tax of RM696.6 million for the current quarter ended 31 December 2016 compared to RM425.8 million in the previous corresponding quarter, an increase of RM270.8 million or 63.6%. Excluding the one-off MSS expense in the previous corresponding quarter, HLB Group PBT increased by RM99.1 mil or 16.6%. The increase was mainly due to higher revenue of RM105.3 million and lower operating expenses of RM157.4 million (inclusive of MSS expense in the previous corresponding quarter) and lower allowance for impairment losses on loans, advances and financing of RM31.7 million. This was however offset by lower share of profit from Bank of Chengdu and Sichuan Jincheng Consumer Finance Joint Venture of RM23.1 million and higher allowance for impairment losses from securities of RM0.5 million.

HLA Holdings Group recorded a profit before tax of RM135.6 million for the current quarter ended 31 December 2016 compared to RM57.3 million in the previous corresponding quarter, an increase of RM78.3 million or 136.6%. The increase was mainly due to lower actuarial reserve provisioning of RM72.7 million, higher share of profit from associated company of RM4.2 million and higher revenue of RM13.2 million. This was however offset by a higher operating expenses of RM4.3 million and higher allowance for impairment losses on securities of RM7.6 million.

Hong Leong Capital Group recorded a profit before tax of RM21.5 million for the current quarter ended 31 December 2016, flat against the previous corresponding quarter.

#### 2 Current period-to-date against previous period-to-date

HLFG Group recorded a profit before tax of RM1,558.0 million for the period ended 31 December 2016 as compared to RM1,184.3 million in the previous corresponding period, an increase of RM373.7 million or 31.6%. Excluding the one-off MSS expense in the previous corresponding period, the Group PBT increased by RM202.0 mil or 15.0%. The increase was mainly due to higher contribution across all operating divisions.

Hong Leong Bank Group recorded a profit before tax of RM1,371.2 million for the period ended 31 December 2016 as compared to RM1,050.6 million in the previous corresponding period, an increase of RM320.6 million or 30.5%. Excluding the one-off MSS expense in the previous corresponding period, HLB Group PBT increased by RM148.9 mil or 12.2%. The increase was due to higher revenue of RM178.2 million, lower operating expenses of RM129.5 million (inclusive of MSS expense in the previous corresponding period) and lower allowance for impairment losses on loans, advances and financing of RM32.7 million. This was however offset by lower share of profit from Bank of Chengdu and Sichuan Jincheng Consumer Finance joint venture of RM13.1 million and higher allowance for impairment losses from securities of RM6.7 million.

HLA Holdings Group recorded a profit before tax of RM189.2 million for the period ended 31 December 2016 as compared to RM131.1 million in the previous corresponding period, an increase of RM58.1 million or 44.3%. The increase was mainly due to lower actuarial reserve provisioning of RM24.3 million, higher revenue of RM26.1 million, lower allowance for impairment losses on securities of RM16.7 million and higher share of profit from associated company of RM1.1 million. This was however offset by higher operating expenses of RM10.1 mil.

Hong Leong Capital Group recorded a profit before tax of RM39.9 million for the period ended 31 December 2016 as compared to RM34.3 million in the previous corresponding period, an increase of RM5.6 million or 16.3%. This was mainly due to higher contribution from the investment banking and stockbroking divisions.

#### 3 Current quarter against preceding quarter

HLFG Group recorded a profit before taxation of RM832.5 million for the current quarter ended 31 December 2016 compared to RM725.5 million in the preceding quarter, an increase of RM107.0 million or 14.7%. The increase was mainly due to higher contribution across all operating divisions.

Hong Leong Bank Group recorded a profit before tax of RM696.6 million for the current quarter ended 31 December 2016 as compared to RM674.6 million in the preceding quarter, an increase of RM22.0 million or 3.3%. The increase was mainly due to higher revenue of RM82.5 million and higher writeback of allowance for impairment losses on securities of RM5.0 million. This was however offset by higher operating expenses of RM10.0 million, lower share of profit from Bank of Chengdu and Sichuan Jincheng Consumer Finance Joint Venture of RM50.1 million and higher allowance for impairment losses on securities of RM5.2 million.

HLA Holdings Group recorded a profit before tax of RM135.6 million for the current quarter ended 31 December 2016 as compared to RM53.6 million in the preceding quarter, an increase of RM82.0 million or 153.0%. The increase was mainly due to lower actuarial reserve provisioning of RM76.2 mil, lower allowance for impairment losses on securities of RM0.5 million and higher share of profit from associated company of RM6.6 million. This was however offset by higher operating expenses of RM1.0 million.

Hong Leong Capital Group recorded a profit before tax of RM21.5 million for the current quarter ended 31 December 2016 compared to RM18.4 million in the preceding quarter, an increase of RM3.1 million or 16.8%. This was mainly due to higher contribution from its investment banking and stockbroking divisions.

#### 4 Prospects for the current year

Barring unforeseen circumstances, the Group is expected to maintain its performance in line with market conditions for the current financial year.

- (ii) On 14 October 2011, the Company entered into RM1.8 billion CP/MTNs Programme comprising a seven (7) years Commercial Papers (CP) programmes and a twenty (20) years Medium Term Notes (MTNs) programmes which were constituted by a Trust Deed between the Company and Malaysian Trustees Berhad as trustee. The CPs carry an interest rate ranging from 3.38% to 3.67% (30 June 2016: 3.58% to 3.86%).

The MTNs are issued at par and the issue price is calculated in accordance with the FAST Rules, at the tenure which shall be more than one (1) year as the Company may select. The MTNs carry interest rates ranging from 4.30% to 4.80% (30 June 2016: 4.30% to 4.80%) per annum.

The CP/MTNs are unsecured and the Company is required to maintain a debt to equity ratio for these facilities.

  - (a) an unsecured short-term loan facility of RM150 million maturing on 11 January 2018. The term loan with one month interest period bears an interest rate ranging from 3.53% to 3.69% (30 June 2016: 3.70% to 3.92%) per annum.

The Sub-Notes are classified as tier 2 capital under Risk-Based Capital Framework for Insurers.

(c) On 17 June 2014, Hong Leong Islamic Bank Berhad ("HLISB"), a wholly owned subsidiary of HLB, had completed the first issuance of RM400 million nominal value of Tier 2 Subordinated Sukuk Ijarah ("Subordinated Sukuk Ijarah") out of its RM1.0 billion Tier 2 Subordinated Sukuk Ijarah Programme. The RM400 million Subordinated Sukuk Ijarah will mature in 2024 and is callable at end of year 5 and on each subsequent coupon payment dates thereafter subject to approval of BNM. The Subordinated Sukuk Ijarah which bears profit rate of 4.80% per annum is payable semi-annually in arrears.

The Subordinated Sukuk Ijarah constitute direct, unconditional, subordinated and unsecured obligations of HLISB and subordinated in right and priority of payment, to the extend and in the manner provided in the Subordinated Sukuk Ijarah, ranking pari passu among themselves. The Subordinated Sukuk Ijarah is subordinated in right of payment to all deposit liabilities and other liabilities of HLISB, except to those liabilities, which by their terms, rank equally in right of payment with or are subordinated to the Subordinated Sukuk Ijarah. The Subordinated Sukuk Ijarah qualifies as Tier 2 capital for the purpose of determining the capital adequacy ratio of HLISB.

(e) On 6 November 2014, Hong Leong Investment Bank Berhad ("HLIB"), a wholly owned subsidiary of Hong Leong Capital Berhad and also an indirect subsidiary of HLFG, had completed the first issuance of RM50 million nominal value of Tier 2 Subordinated Notes ("Sub-Notes") out of its RM1.0 billion Multi-Currency Sub-Notes Programme. The RM50 million Sub-Notes will mature in 2024 and is callable on any coupon payment date falling on or after the 5th anniversary of the issue date. On 10 September 2009, Promino, an indirect subsidiary of the Company, issued the first tranche of Innovative Tier 1 Capital Securities ("IT-1 Capital Securities") amounting to RM500 million in nominal value, from its RM1.0 billion IT-1 Capital Securities Programme. The IT-1 Capital Securities is structured in accordance with the Risk-Weighted Capital Adequacy Framework (General Requirements and Capital Components) issued by BNM.

The RM500 million IT-1 Capital Securities has a tenor of 30 years and Promino has the option to redeem the RM500 million IT-1 Capital Securities at the 10th anniversary, subject to BNM approval. The RM500 million IT-1 Capital Securities has a coupon rate of 8.25% per annum, payable semi-annually. In the event the IT-1 Capital Securities is not redeemed at the 10th anniversary (the First Optional Redemption Date), the coupon rate will be revised to 9.25% per annum from the 11th year to the final maturity.

On 1 July 2011, the above IT-Capital Securities was vested to HLB. The IT-1 Capital Securities constitute unsecured and subordinated obligations of HLB and are subordinated to all deposit liabilities and all other liabilities except those liabilities which rank equally in, and/or junior to, the rights of payment of the IT-1 Capital Securities. The IT-1 Capital Securities qualify as Tier 1 capital for the purpose of computing the capital adequacy ratio of HLB Group and HLB.

#### Market risk

Market risk is the potential change in value caused by movement in market rates or prices. The contractual amounts stated above provide only a measure of involvement in these types of transactions and do not represent the amount subject to market risk. Exposure to market risk may be reduced through offsetting on and off-balance sheet positions. As at the end of the financial year, the amount of contracts which were not hedged effectively and hence, exposed to foreign exchange and interest rate market risk were RM35,119,290 (FYE June 2016: RM20,017,001) and RM87,179,296,179 (FYE June 2016: RM76,308,873,177) respectively.

#### Derivatives

Market risk arises from the impact on trading positions of changes in foreign exchange rates and interest rates. It also includes the impact from changes in the correlations and volatilities of other risk factors. The Group manages trading market risk in the course of market-making, structuring and packaging products for investors and other clients, as well as to benefit from market opportunities. The Group's market risk framework identifies the types of the market risk to be covered, the risk metrics and methodologies to be used to capture such risk and the standards governing the management of market risk within the Group including limit setting and independent model validation, monitoring and valuation. Management of derivatives risks is continually reviewed and enhanced to ensure that the complexities of the business are appropriately controlled.

#### Credit risk

Credit risk arises from the possibility that a counter-party may be unable to meet the terms of a contract in which the Group has a gain position. As at the end of the financial year, the amount of credit risk, measured in terms of the cost to replace the profitable contracts was RM1,657,113,164 (FYE June 2016: RM1,031,399,571). This amount will increase or decrease over the life of the contracts, mainly as a function of maturity dates and market rates or prices.

#### **Derivatives**

The amount subject to credit risk is limited to the current fair value of instruments that are favourable to the Group (ie, assets where their fair value is positive), which in relation to derivatives is only a small fraction of the contract, or notional values used to express the volume of instruments outstanding. This credit risk exposure is managed as part of the overall lending limits with customers, together with potential exposures from market movements. Collateral or other security is not usually obtained for credit risk exposures on these instruments, except where the Group requires margin deposits from counterparties.

The Group uses the following derivative instruments for both hedging and non-hedging purposes:

Currency forwards represent commitments to purchase foreign and domestic currency, including undelivered spot transactions. Interest rate futures are contractual obligations to receive or pay a net amount based on changes in currency rates or interest rates, or to buy or sell foreign currency or a financial instrument on a future date at a specified price, established in an organised financial market. The credit risk is of futures contracts is negligible, as futures contracts are collateralised by cash or marketable securities, and changes in the futures' contact value are settled daily with the exchange.

Currency and interest rate swaps are commitments to exchange one set of cash flows for another. Swaps result in an economic exchange of currencies or interest rates (for example, fixed rate for floating rate) or a combination of all these (ie, cross-currency interest rate swaps). No exchange of principal takes place, except for certain currency swaps. The Group's credit risk represents the potential cost to replace the swap contracts if counterparties fail to fulfil their obligation. This risk is monitored on an ongoing basis with reference to the current fair value, a proportion of the notional amount of the contracts and the liquidity of the market. To control the level of credit risk taken, the Group assesses counterparties using the same techniques as for its lending activities.

Foreign currency and interest rate options are contractual agreements under which the seller (writer) grants the purchaser (holder) the right, but not the obligation, either to buy (a call option) or sell (a put option) at or by a set date or during a set period, a specific amount of a foreign currency or a financial instrument at a predetermined price. The seller receives a premium from the purchaser in consideration for the assumption of foreign exchange or interest rate risk. Options may be either exchange-traded or negotiated between the Group and a customer (OTC). The Group is exposed to credit risk on purchased options only, and only to the extent of their carrying amount, which is their fair value.

The notional amounts of certain types of financial instrument provide a basis for comparison with instruments recognised on the balance sheet but do not necessarily indicate the amounts of future cash flows involved or the current fair value of the instruments and, therefore, do not indicate the Group's exposure to credit or price risks. The derivative instruments become favourable (assets) or unfavourable (liabilities) as a result of fluctuations in market interest rates or foreign exchange rates relative to their terms. The aggregate contractual or notional amount of derivative financial instruments on hand, the extent to which instruments are favourable or unfavourable, and thus the aggregate fair values of derivative financial assets and liabilities, can fluctuate significantly from time to time.

#### Liquidity risk

#### Derivatives

Liquidity risk arises in any situation where a payment in cash, securities or equities is made in the expectation of a corresponding receipt in cash, securities or equities. Daily settlement limits are established for each counterparty to cover the aggregate of all settlement risk arising from the Group's market transactions on any single day.

#### Related accounting policies

Derivative financial instruments are measured at fair value and are carried as assets when the fair value is positive and as liabilities when the fair value is negative. Any gain or loss arising from a change in the fair value of the derivatives is recognised in the income statements unless they are part of a hedging relationship which qualifies for hedge accounting where the gain or loss is recognised as follows:

#### Fair value hedge

Where a derivative financial instrument hedges the changes in fair value of a recognised asset or liability, any gain or loss on the hedging instrument is recognised in the income statement. The hedged item is also stated at fair value in respect of the risk being hedged, with any gain or loss being recognised in the income statement.

#### Cash flow hedge

Gains and losses on the hedging instrument, to the extent that the hedge is effective, are deferred in the separate component of equity. The ineffective part of any gain or loss is recognised in the income statement. The deferred gains and losses are then released to the income statement in the years when the hedged items affects the income statement.

#### 14 Material litigation

The Group does not have any material litigation which, in the opinion of the Directors, would have a material adverse impact on the financial results of the Group.

#### 15 HLFG Dividends

For the financial year ended 31 December 2016, a single-tier dividend of 13 sen per share was declared (31 December 2015: 13 sen per share) and paid on 23 December 2016.

#### (a) Basic earnings per share

Basic earnings per share is calculated by dividing the net profit attributable to equity holders of the Company by the weighted average number of ordinary shares (excluding treasury shares) in issue during the financial period.
